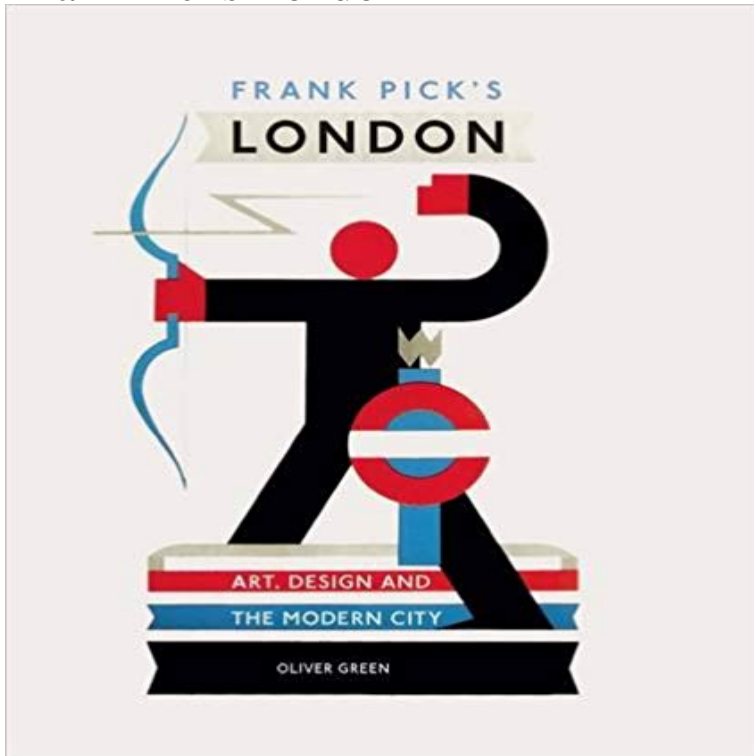


Frank Picks London
