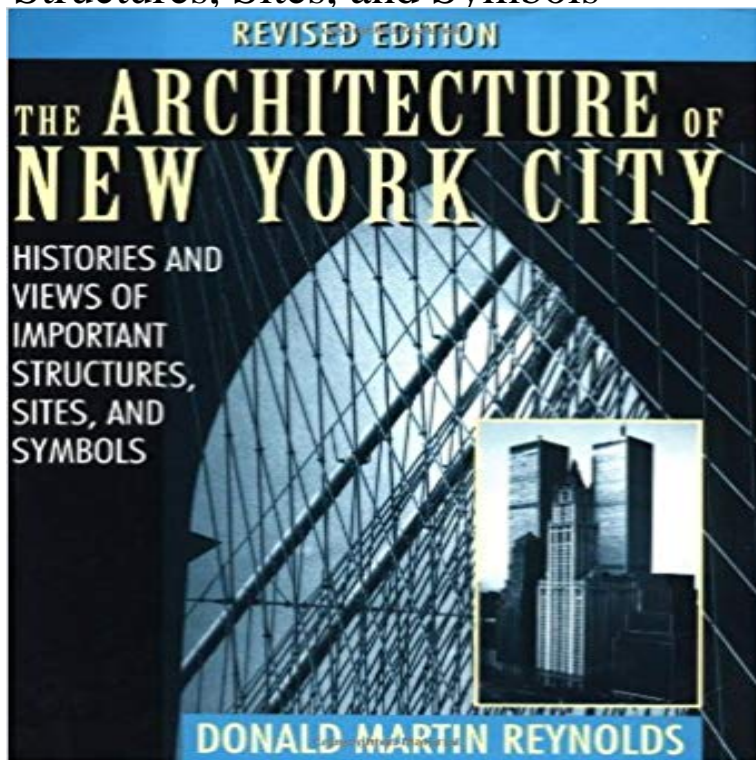


# The Architecture of New York City: Histories and Views of Important Structures, Sites, and Symbols
