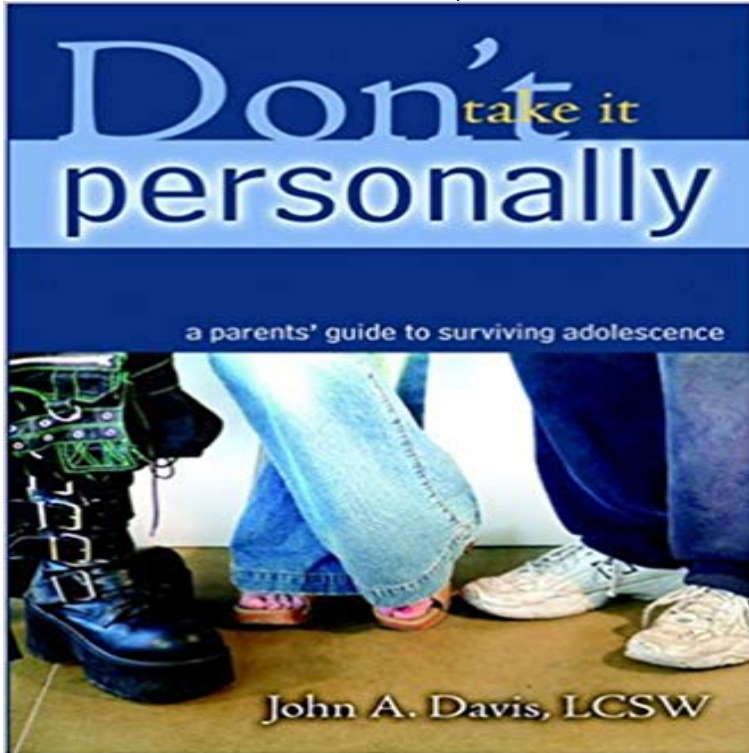


Dont Take It Personally: A Parents Guide to Surviving Adolescence
