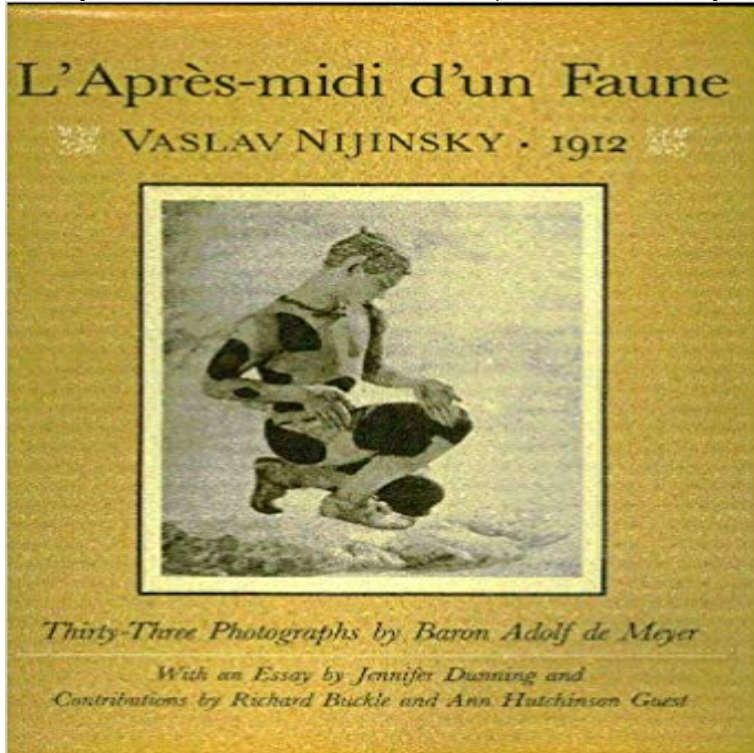


L'Après-Midi du Faune, Vaslav Nijinsky, 1912
