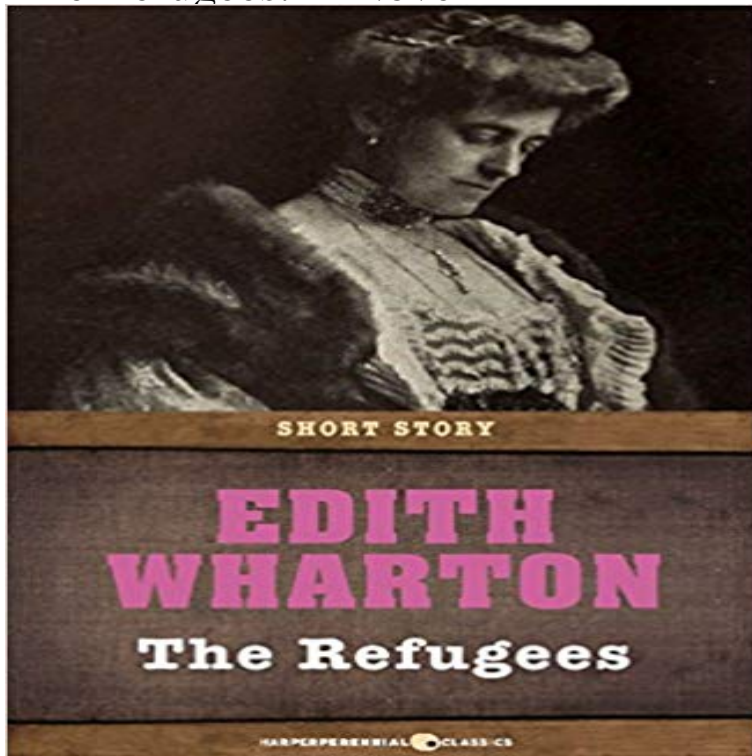


The Refugees: A Novel
